Forces 7LA have been learning about Friction and Air Resistance in their Science lesson. Students have learned that friction is a force that slows objects down and it can occur when an object moves through water or air and air resistance is a type of friction between air and another material. Students then demonstrated these forces by making paper planes to show this. The plane falls to the ground much more slowly and gracefully than a scrunched-up piece of paper. This is all thanks to the forces generated by air pressing on and moving over the surface of the paper.
