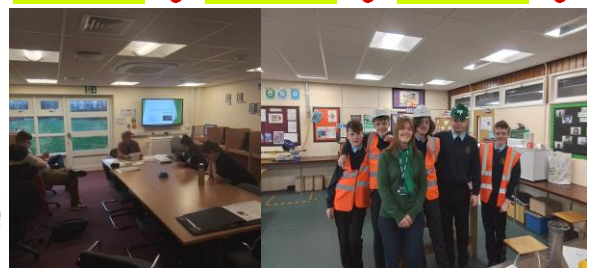

Year 11 Careers Day Students in year 11 took part in a Careers Day to learn more about various careers and opportunities in their community. The workshops covered topics such as careers in gaming with D3T, local labour market information with Job Centre Plus, careers in construction with Keep Moat Homes, higher education from Liverpool John Moores University and information about supported internships and apprenticeships from Halton Borough Council. The day was exciting and interesting, with the students posing many inquiries regarding the various job roles.
