

RSE Year 10 Students have been participating in RSE lessons focused on consent, exploring its meaning and importance in healthy relationships. Discussions have covered topics like freely given, enthusiastic, and ongoing consent, as well as the significance of respecting boundaries and recognising when consent is not present. The lessons aim to equip students with the knowledge and skills to navigate relationships responsibly and respectfully.

In their independent travel training, Year 10 students have focused on identifying safe seating areas on public buses. This includes understanding the benefits of sitting near the driver, avoiding obstructed areas, and being aware of emergency exits. These lessons are designed to build confidence and ensure students can travel safely and independently.
