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### Ashley Action!

**8LQ** students explored the diverse world of egg preparation in their Food Technology lessons, expertly learning to scramble, fry, poach, and boil eggs.

**Pizza** As part of a recent project focusing on bread products, 7LA students learnt to make their own pizza dough. They then enjoyed a 'topping bar' to create unique pizzas and designed personalised boxes to take their creations home.

**Practical Learning** In Forest School, students have been developing practical outdoor skills by learning how to tie various knots and effectively use ropes. The visit allowed them to explore various departments, speak with current college students and lecturers, and participate in interactive taster sessions.
